



MICR Number | Account Information

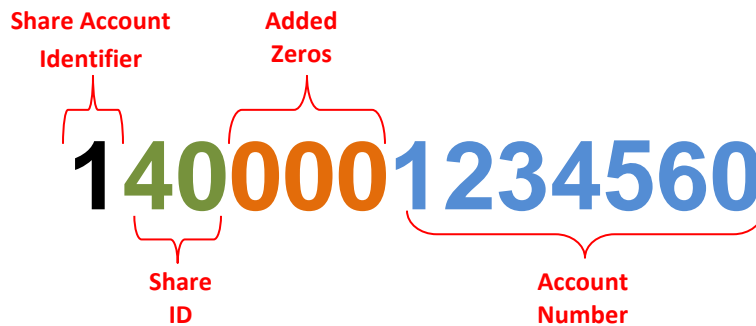
If I need my account number to set up Direct Deposit or automatic payments, where can I find it?

If you have checks, your 13-digit Account/MICR Number can be found on the bottom of your checks. You will see a series of numbers separated by colons (:) or other symbols. Your Account/MICR number is the series of numbers in the 'middle' (see below).

Example: 314088572: **1400001234560** : 1234

The full MICR Number is very important when providing it to your Payroll Department and/or Vendors for payments. The 13-digit Account Number must be provided to insure proper credit and/or withdrawal.

MICR numbers are 13 digits long. Here is an example of a MICR line and a breakdown of its components.

Share Account Identifier: The first number designates this as a Share account.

- "1"= Share account
- There will never be anything but a "1" as the first number

Share I.D.: The next 2 numbers will identify the **Share ID**. ("Account type")

- A Share ID will always be 2 digits long

000

Added Zeros: This will be the beginning of the account number which will be as many zeros as needed to make the number a 13-digit number.

- If the member's account number is "123456" you will need to add 4 zeros in front of that to equal the 13 digits you need to create a full account number.
- Account number "123456"= 140**0000**123456
- Account number 2001247= 140**000**2001247

Account Number: The remaining numbers are the members account number.

- Current account numbers could be anywhere from 4 digits to 8 digits long
